George Washington High School GOALS

- 1. At least 50% of students will attend 95% of days or more.
- 2. At least 75% of first time 9th grade students will be on track to earn a minimum of 5 quality credits each marking
- 3. Increase the percentage of student proficiency of first time test takers on the Algebra Keystone Exams by 6%. Prog
- 4. At least 90% of 9th grade students will have 0 Out of School Suspensions.
- 5. At least 95% of 12th grade students will be on track for graduation.

Share important information that could have an impact on my child's academic or social success with the school. Consistently monitor my child's attendance and grades.

Read all information sent home from my child's school and become involved, to the extent possible, in the School Advisory Council and other parent engagement activities.

STUDENT RESPONSIBILITIES:

Arrive on time to school daily.

Arrive on time to each class, prepared with class materials, books and a writing implement.

Speak with an adult regarding any issues that may hinder my success.

Serve as a respectful advocate for myself and regarding school concerns.

Complete all assignments and turn them in on time.

Read at least 30 to 45 minutes each day outside of school, independent of assigned homework activities.

Maintain positive behavior at all times and pay attention in class.

Not engage with social media use while in school.

Be respectful when posting and communicating on social media.

Accept and respect others, and seek to understand those not familiar.

Uphold cleanliness in the school environment.
